

Transparency Collage-ssemblage: I Can See Clearly Now

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Supply List

1. Acrylic Paint: MUST HAVE I prefer Golden products but Liquitex will also work.
 - a. Titanium White
 - b. Mars Black
 - c. Quinacridone Nickel Azo Gold
 - d. Quinacridone Crimson
 - e. Dioxazine Purple
 - f. Pthalo Green (blue shade)
2. Optional Paints (I'll be going over some techniques with some of these as well so if you want to have some to play with bring them)
 - a. Paynes Gray
 - b. Permanent Violet
 - c. Nickel Azo Yellow
 - d. Van Dyke Brown
3. Brushes:
 - a. Cheap 1 inch-ish
 - b. Good quality detail brushes
4. Glues
 - a. Liquid Nails Clear, or E 6000
 - b. GOLDEN Semi Gloss Gel
5. Cutting tools
 - a. Scissors or an exacto knife
6. Transparencies- You can print these on a inkjet printer or a laser printer (the laser will be less likely to run). You can also take your images to Kinkos and have transparent photocopies made. Bring a plethora of images...more is better. You'll never know what will come in handy.
 - a. You could also use stamps if you have them
 - b. You could stamp on Mica.
7. Ephemera and non-transparent collage items. Could be anything from paper to fabric, to mesh to whatever.
8. A variety of small doodads...and when I say variety, I mean variety. Anything that has an interesting shape, pattern or color would be good.
9. A small box, frame, cigar box, or block of wood. This will be the base of your piece. I would say nothing over 5" x 7" (but really that is up to you)
10. Optional tools (don't worry if you don't have this stuff...I'll have some)
 - a. Soldering iron or a miniature butane torch.
 - b. Heat gun
